# Support for Novel Heart Therapy Makes a Lasting Impact

In 2015, Dr. Chuck Abbottsmith made a generous donation to Enhanced External Counterpulsation (EECP) therapy in The Christ Hospital Heart and Vascular Program. EECP is a safe, non-invasive therapy used to treat coronary artery disease and heart failure, as well as manage or eliminate angina, fatigue, and shortness of breath.

"EECP plays a key role in the treatment of patients with ongoing symptoms despite bypass surgery and stenting, and is a beneficial option for patients who cannot undergo surgery," says Dr. Timothy Henry, Distinguished Chair of Clinical Research and Medical Director of The Christ Hospital Lindner Research Center.

During EECP therapy, patients lie on a bed with compression cuffs placed on their calves, thighs, and hips that inflate and deflate in sync with their heartbeat. The squeezing mechanism promotes circulation and improves blood flow to the heart. At The Christ Hospital, EECP therapy is provided for one hour, five times per week, over the course of seven weeks, and has been shown to increase energy, reduce the need for medications, and improve quality of life.

"EECP has a 75-80% success rate, and the benefit lasts up to five years," says Dr. Abbottsmith. "Patients often tell us that the treatment has given them their lives back."

Over the past four years, more than 200 patients have benefitted from EECP thanks to Dr. Abbottsmith's donation.
