# PGY2 Ambulatory Care Residency Program

PGY2 residency programs build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency training to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives for advanced practice areas. Residents who successfully complete PGY2 residency programs are prepared for advanced patient care or other specialized positions, and board certification in the advanced practice area, if available.

# **Program Overview**

Each resident will be an integral part of the medication use process. The residency will serve to help the resident develop an understanding of the clinical, distributive, and administrative aspects of ambulatory care pharmacy. Through a variety of required and elective learning experiences, residents will gain confidence to effectively function as a member of a multidisciplinary team. Additionally, the program will focus on developing and refining the resident's writing, presentation, teaching, research, and leadership skills in ambulatory care pharmacy.
