

Residency Position Statement

PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification, if available.

Each resident will be an integral part of the medication use process. The residency will serve to help the resident develop a secure understanding of the clinical, distributive, and administrative aspects of the practice of cardiology pharmacy. - Graduate of an ACPE-accredited College of Pharmacy with a Doctor of Pharmacy degree
- Participating in or completion of an ASHP-accredited PGY-1 residency or one in the accreditation process
- Eligible for pharmacist licensure in Ohio
- US citizen or legal resident
- Meets criteria for employment at The Christ Hospital, including vaccination requirements and a negative drug and tobacco screen
