**Did you have a Pregnancy in the
Last 1-10 years?**

**Were YOU Diagnosed with
Preeclampsia During Pregnancy?**

STUDY OVERVIEW:

The **Hypertensive Disorders of Pregnancy: Pathways to Future Cardiovascular Disease** study is a National Institute Health (NIH) study to evaluate the effects of preeclampsia on heart structure and function.

As part of the study women will undergo blood vessel functioning tests, cardiac magnetic resonance imaging and blood tests to evaluate heart function. Research study tests are free of charge to all participants. The results of this study will not affect clinical care.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Women with pregnancy preeclampsia or healthy pregnancy to serve as a comparison group in the last 1-10 years with.

INCLUSION CRITERIA:

- Women \geq 18 years of age
- Diagnosis of preeclampsia (toxemia, high blood pressure with protein in the urine or other organ dysfunction) during pregnancy
- Women with normal pregnancies will be enrolled for comparison to women with preeclampsia
- Have completed a pregnancy in the last 1-10 years

EXCLUSION CRITERIA:

- Pregnant or breastfeeding at time of study participation
- Multiparity in pregnancy (twins, triplets, etc.)
- Three or more births (parity > 3) in lifetime
- Significant medical illness, severe renal disease, hypertension or hypertension medications, severe COPD/asthma, obesity (BMI>35)
- Contraindications to cardiac magnetic resonance imaging, adenosine, or regadeneson
